

# Repercussions of Lockdown due to Pandemic on Faculties in Academic Institutions

As the teachers would not get their full remuneration till now in some colleges, this will give them mental and financial burden so they do not feel motivated enough and doesn't thrive their best efforts in teaching.

### **4. Lack of learning Classroom Environment:**

The tradition of a face-to-face meeting is lost and so as their interest of learning gets affected. Interpersonal relationship between not only students and teachers or between students may hamper but also their studies. They often feel the sense of isolation.

## **FINDINGS:**

### **Online classes And mental Health of Teachers:**

The online teaching process has left teachers overworked and hence they tend to break out with mental pressure. The work becomes difficult when the direct contact was replaced by an online relationship, and many other factors should be considered. Teachers, in general, are not trained for e-learning programs and activities, mainly when parents are not prepared for the distance and homeschooling. So teachers experience confusion and stress because they are often unsure of their obligations and how to maintain connections with students to support learning. Despite governments' efforts to provide training and resources to support teachers in adapting to this new learning environment, turning from face-to-face to virtual classroom in such a short time has been a challenge as only a few teachers have command on this digital skills. Some teachers have spoken about their mental trauma. Many female teachers are extremely conscious about what they are wear and how they are sit in front of the screen as the students often give unusual gestures and use offensive language. Therefore, in such unprecedented times, it is normal for teachers to experience higher levels of stress and anxiety. Teachers need, indeed, socio-emotional support to face the extra pressure being put on them to deliver learning in a time of crisis.

## **ISSUES DURING ONLINE TEACHING**

The sudden shift to e-learning has been stressful for both teachers and students. However, there is no doubt that the new equilibrium of learning will transform the education sector. For teachers, their online battles with learning and unruly students could leave impressions that last beyond the

immediate concerns of the lockdown. After having an in-depth interview from faculties from different colleges the major issues that they had to confronted with were summarised as below:
