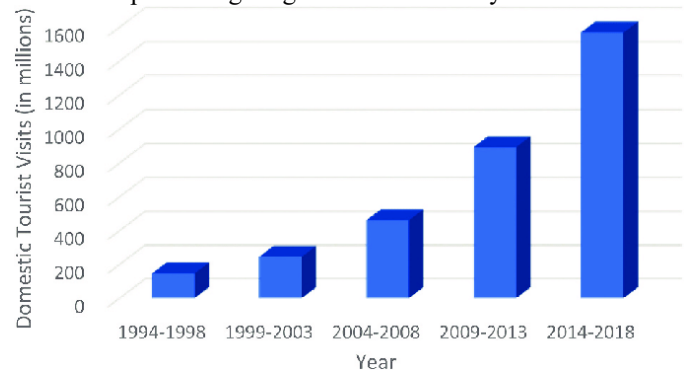


Fig 1. Increase in rural tourism

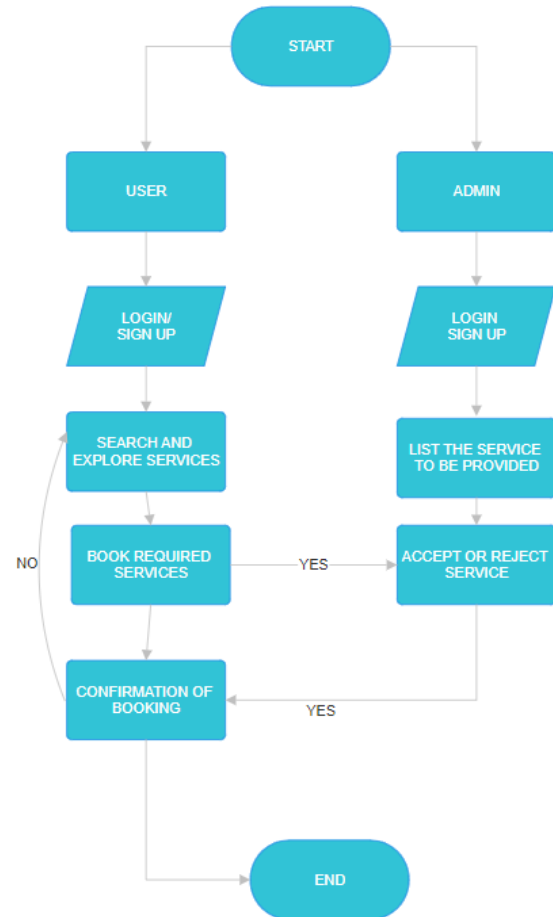



Fig. 2. Flow Chart

VII. RESULT


