Kerala's lengthy coastline is intricately linked to the state's culture, customs, and traditions. Early mariners and traders are no longer remembered, but boats of many types and forms have survived. Kerala's beaches, namely Kovalam, were rediscovered by backpackers and tanners in the 1960s. In the 1970s, hordes of hippies flocked to the area. That was the beginning of the village's metamorphosis from a sleepy fishing village to a bustling tourist destination (3) In 2002, there were 66 hotels in Kovalam, despite the fact that it is only 16 kilometres from Thiruvananthapuram, the state capital.

## MAIN BODY

The 550-kilometer Arabian Sea coastline of Kerala, India, is lined with beaches. Kerala is an Indian state located in the subcontinent's southwest quadrant. The coastline's topography is distinct and abruptly varies as one travels from north to south. The headlands rise above the shore from the beach's edge in places like Bekal, Thalassery, and Kannur in Kerala's northern reaches. The forts established by the colonial powers - the Portuguese, the Dutch, and the British - dot the highlands. The surrounding area's scenery is breathtaking. The landscape changes from flat fields with rocky outcroppings protruding out from Kozhikode, previously the Malabar coast's core. One trait is found in vast numbers across the coconut tree. Coconut groves abound along the coast and reach into the interiors.

From a low of 29,000 international travellers in 1979 to 225,000 in 2000, the number of visitors to Kerala is continuously increasing. The number of foreign tourists that visited Kerala in 2006 was 428,534, up 23.68 percent from the previous year. Tourist arrivals in the United States were 6,271,724, up 5.47 percent over the previous year [5]. Ayurveda, beaches, and (backwater) canals are the ABCs of Kerala tourism.

While specific information on incoming tourists is not available, a poll indicates that domestic tourists are primarily from Gujarat and Maharashtra, both on India's west coast, and overseas tourists are primarily from Europe. Beaches were a popular tourist destination for international visitors. These are some of Kerala's most important beaches.

### **1. CHERAI BEACH**

Cherai Beach is a well-known beach and a popular tourist destination in the state. Throughout the year, the beach attracts both domestic and international visitors. The beach contributes a significant portion of the state's tourism revenue. The beach is 25 kilometres from Ernakulam city and 30 kilometres from Cochin international airport and is located in the northern section of Vypin Island. The beach offers a beautiful view of the sea and lagoons. Other notable features include coconut palms, rice fields, sea shells, and Chinese nets. In the month of December, the beach holds the annual Cherai beach fest.

Munambam Beach is located on the northern extremity of Vypin Island, alongside the Periyar Estuary, which forms the Ernakulam district's border. The beach's main attractions are the Chinese nets and the beach boardwalk. The beach is 5 kilometres north of Cherai beach and 30 kilometres south of Ernakulam city.

## **10. PERIYAMBALAM BEACH**

Thrissur town is roughly 40 kilometres from Periyambalam beach. It is well-known for its Ramacham plantation. This beach attracts visitors from all around the world. People come here with their families and friends because the beach is tranquil and safe. The beach has a few tea and snack stores, but there are no restaurants. Visitors tend to spend more time at the beach, but the lack of adequate lighting makes it difficult for them to do so. The beach has upgraded its facilities by adding chairs and restrooms in comparison to previous years. However, the use of granted funds for beach rehabilitation is questionable, as locals believe that using funds for the beach is useless.

The park has a marine aquarium as well as a lovely lawn. The beach is believed to be a safe and relaxing environment to sit, converse, and relax. The beach is accessible at all hours of the day and night, thanks to suitable illumination. People can obtain meals and refreshments from a few restaurants and various sellers in and around the beach.

## **19. BEYPORE BEACH**

Kerala, India. Vaypura / Vadaparappanad was the previous name for the area. The town was given the name "Sultan Pattanam" by Tipu Sultan, the ruler of Mysore. There is a beach and a marina, and beypore fort is one of Kerala's oldest ports, historically trading with the middle east. beypore is famed for its wooden watercraft, often known as dhows or urus in malayalam. Originally purchased by arab merchants for trading and fishing, these ships are now employed as tourist vessels. Sumerian ships may have been built in beypure, according to captain iwata a founding member of the association of Sumerian ships in japan. Beypore had direct trading relations with Mesopotamia, according to evidence. There are restrooms available.

## **20. MUZHAPPILANGAD BEACH**

Muzhappilangad beach is the state's sole drive-in beach and the country's longest of its kind. The beach is located 7 kilometres from Thalassery in the Kannur district, along NH 66. Anyone can bike for 400 metres on a sandy beach without stopping, which is an incredible experience. 100 metres from the shore is the well-known Dharmadam Island. When the water is low, we can walk to the island, which makes the journey much more memorable. The beach is surrounded by black rocks that protect it from strong sea currents, making it ideal for shallow water swimming. Following the start of the Annual Beach Festival in April, the beach has seen a surge in popularity.

- ❖ provide refreshment stalls
- ❖ Appoint more beach staff

## **21.BEKAL BEACH**

Bekal Beach is located in Kazargode, Kerala's northernmost district. The beach lies very next to the state's largest fort, the Bekal Fort. Bekal Resorts Development Corporation built the beach in its current unique state (BRDC). Bekal Beach Park was built by the BRDC and today contributes to the beach's beauty. The beach boardwalk offers a panoramic view of the beach that will soothe and relax anyone's mind. The view from the cliff top of the Bekal Fort transports you back to those historic times. The park contains a well-kept green space, a children's park, and a few eateries that provide comfort to all beach visitors. There is also a safe drinking water facility, which ensures that all guests have access to pure and safe drinking water.

- ❖ Lacks proper first aid facility

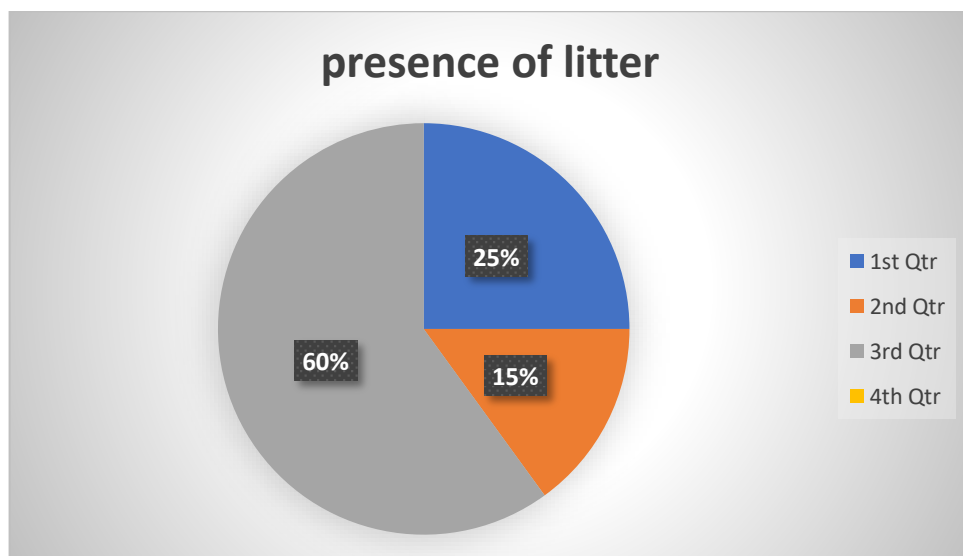

## AVAILABILITY OF ESSENTIAL FACILITIES IN BEACHES

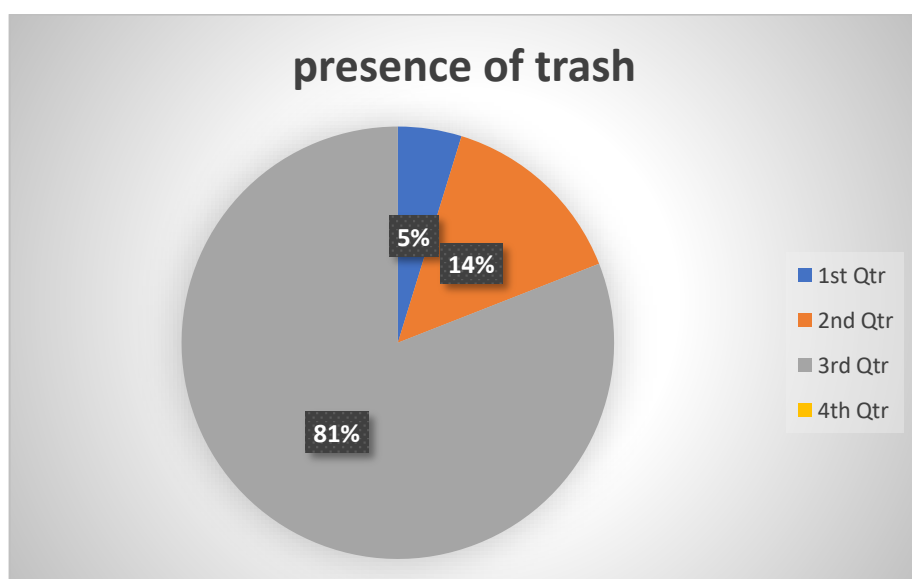
- **PRESENCE OF LITTER**

- **PRESENCE OF TRASH**

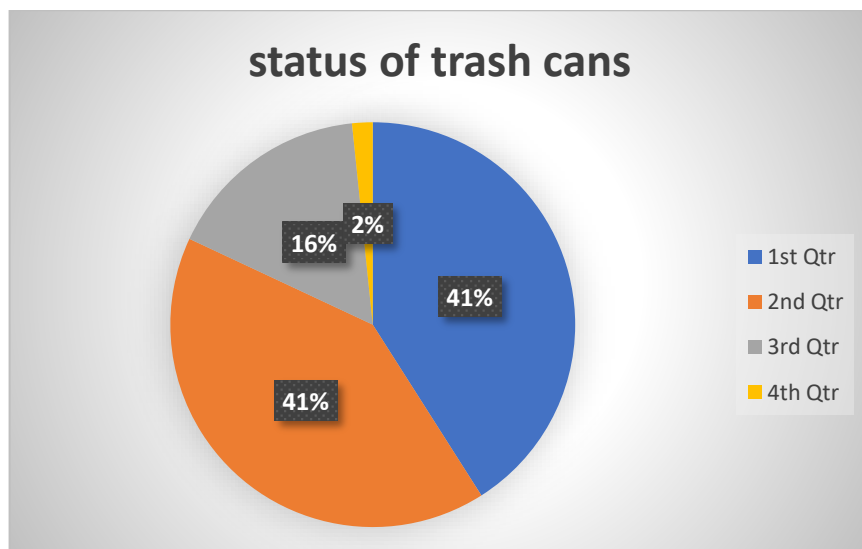
Most of the beaches have only a little risky litter presence in it. 10% beaches have some risky litter in it while 5% beaches have a lot of risky litter presence .





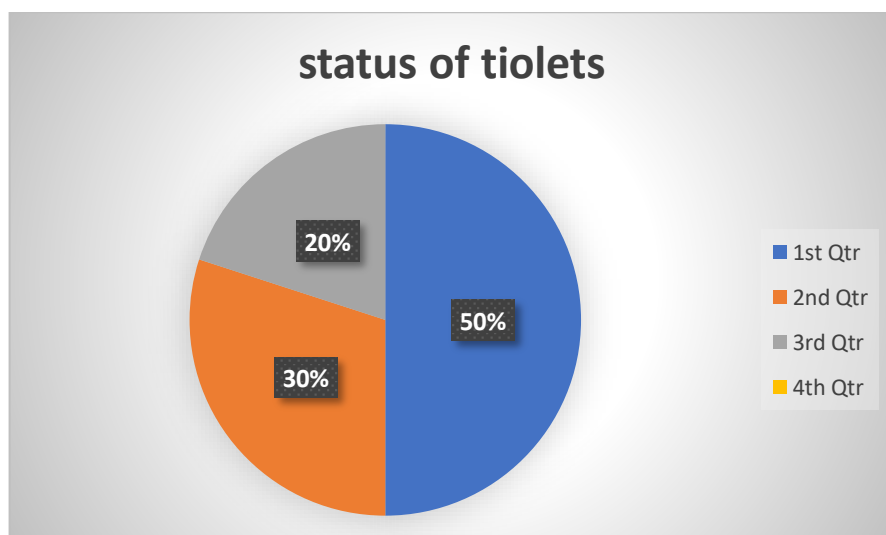
### • STATUS OF TRASH CANS

When 30% of the beaches provide good and adequate trash cans. 30% of the beaches don't even have one. Trash cans can be rated average in 12% beaches while the condition is poor in 28% beaches.



### • STATUS OF TOILETS

Half of the beach toilets can be rated average while 30% beaches have good and proper toilet facility. toilets are not available in 20% beaches.



## **Conclusion and Recommendations**

Kerala's beaches are both geographically and economically important. Despite being one of the state's key sources of tourism earnings, the majority of the beaches are in disarray. Many beaches are on the threat of failing their beauty owing to various concerns that have gone unresolved as a result of ignorance and incompetence. Pollution from numerous things such as plastic and other pollutants, as well as a lack of suitable amenities and services for guests, have had a negative impact on the beaches. These are important concerns that emerged from the research. The concentration of development in a few beaches, such as Kovalam, Snehatheeram, and Cherai, is a key cause in this dire condition. Beaches with a lengthy history and culture, such as Fort Kochi, as well as beaches with significant growth potential, such as Vadanappilly and Puthuvype, are entirely overlooked on the development plan. If this condition persists, it will have a negative impact on the beaches' ecology, economy, and tourism. It is past time for all of the state's beaches to be developed in a sustainable and inclusive manner. This study report can be used by authorities as a reference for effective planning and execution.

### **Certain recommendations are put forward as part of the study**

- ❖ Ensure safe drinking water facility in every beach
- ❖ Provide adequate infrastructure in the beaches
- ❖ Construct and maintain proper green space
- ❖ Ensure safety of the visitors
- ❖ Provide emergency care service for the visitors
- ❖ Construct play space / children's park in each beach
- ❖ Constitute beach development committee specifically for each beach for coordinating the developmental activities .
